 - a. Student Government (E. Conde)
 - i. The SG President attended a graduation initiative conference, representing student interests and learning about campus success and retention strategies.
 - ii. The SG President also attended CSSA (California State Student Association) to stay informed on statewide student advocacy issues.
 - iii. The California State Special Election will take place on November 4th. Student Government conducted outreach to encourage student voter registration and participation, setting up registration opportunities across campus.
 - b. Student Programming Board (C. Gil)
 - i. Trivia Throwdown was held on October 6th with a CSUCI Pride theme. The event was sponsored by Homecoming and offered meal tickets to attendees, attracting approximately 64 participants.
 - ii. Foodie Tuesday, part of Homecoming week, saw a strong turnout with 457 attendees enjoying various food options and activities.
 - iii. Together We Craft: Pumpkins and Pallets offered students a creative outlet through pumpkin decorating, engaging 119 participants.
 - iv. The Block Party, taking place today, is Peanuts-themed and will include a costume contest where the DJ will select a winner to receive a \$100 gift card. Students also receive food tickets and may bring guests to the event.

- v. “Black Phone 2” Movie Screening will be held on October 28th at the Roxy Stadium Theater. The event is free for students, with no reservation required admission will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

- c. Student Union (A.J. Antonio)
 - i. The Tiny Mic Series has returned, providing a platform to highlight student voices and perspectives on campus life.
 - ii. Facility updates: The Student Union will be closed on November 11th for Veterans Day, and on November 27–28 for Thanksgiving Break.
 - iii. Rock Your Crocs event welcomed 27 attendees, encouraging creativity and community.
 - iv. The LGBTQ+ Book Giveaway engaged 10 attendees, promoting inclusivity and literacy.
 - v. Grocery Plinko held on October 21st attracted approximately 60 students.
 - vi. Upcoming events include the Candy Crawl on October 30th, featuring 18 campus partners to showcase collaboration across departments.
 - vii. Rock Your Crocs event scheduled for November 12th.

- d. The CI View (T. Walker)
 - i. Members of The CI View attended the Media Fest Conference in Washington, D.C., where interns and student assistants gained valuable hands-on experience and professional development opportunities in journalism and media production.
 - ii. The CI View will also participate in the Candy Crawl on October 30th, engaging students and promoting campus media involvement.
- e. Community Report: (K. Robinson)
 - i. Moorpark College Recognition: Moorpark College was named the top community college in the Los Angeles area and #7 in California for graduate return on investment by the Golden Returns Study. Oxnard College also earned #9 in the state.
 - ii. Growth in Dual Enrollment: Dual enrollment at Moorpark College continues to expand, increasing from 2,415 students in 2022–23 to 3,744 in 2024–25, with plans to grow both high school partnership pathways and academic enrichment programs.
 - iii. STEM Transfer Day Collaboration: Students from Moorpark, Oxnard, and Ventura Colleges attended CSUCI’s STEM Transfer Day, hosted by Project AYUDAS, featuring hands-on sessions in STEM and the CSU Transfer Planner. Moorpark will return next month for the SCCUR research conference.
 - iv. Area 805 Partnership: The VCCCD is connecting students and faculty with the new Area 805 Autonomous Innovation Center at Camarillo Airport, supporting workforce training, apprenticeships, and innovation in advanced air mobility and clean technology.
 - v. Ventura College hosted a CA Student Aid Commission press conference launching the 2026–27 financial aid cycle.

- vi. Oxnard College will host a Día de los Muertos celebration on October 30, featuring music, Aztec dancers, and community collaboration
