  - a. ACTION ITEM: Approval of minutes from March 12, 2026

- 5) Public Forum: *None*
- 6) Reports:
  - a. Student Government (E. Conde)
    - i. Washington, D.C. advocacy trip took place with the Interim President and a Congressman, with discussions focused on potential Pell Grant cuts.
    - ii. Preparations are underway for the swearing-in ceremony of the new Student Government team, scheduled for May 6 at 11:00 AM at the Dolphin Deck.
    - iii. Student Government hosted voter registration tabling on April 23 and April 30 from 10:00 AM to 12:30 PM in front of the library to support students in checking their voter registration status.
    - iv. The Senate continues to work on resolutions, which will be discussed at upcoming Senate meetings held on Wednesdays from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM in the Coville Conference Room.
  - b. Student Programming Board (K. Munoz)
    - i. No Report.
      1. H. Alatorre shared that Dolphinpaloosa took place on April 22, with approximately 560 attendees. The event featured eight food trucks, interactive activities, and student vendors.

- c. Student Union (A.J. Antonio)
  - i. The Student Union participated in Dolphinpalooza on April 22 by distributing 150 tote bags with custom iron-on patches.
  - ii. Admitted Dolphin Day occurred on April 18 and English and Spanish tours were offered every 30 minutes.
  - iii. The Student Union Building (SUB) front desk will be closed on April 28 from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM for the DSA Student Assistant Celebration; the building will remain open.
  - iv. The SUB will be fully closed on May 13 beginning at 3:00 PM for the end-of-year celebration. This closure will not impact Dolphin Den operations.
  - v. The SUB will close at 8:00 PM on May 18 for the DSA Late Night Breakfast event.
  - vi. Recent programs included: Rock Your Crocs on March 12 with 17 attendees; Heritage Book on April 2 with 10 attendees; Grocery Plinko on April 13 with 165 attendees; and Spring Crawl on April 8, which included two grand prize winners, ten golden egg winners, six additional golden egg winners leading up to the event, 121 total attendees, and 66 students who completed the full route.
  - vii. Upcoming programs include Finals Fuel from May 4–6 and Coffee Convo on May 12.
- d. The CI View (T. Walker)
  - i. The CI View provided coverage of the recent elections.
  - ii. The team plans to meet with Professor Caravello this week to develop a short documentary-style video, approximately 10–20 minutes in length.
- e. Community Report: (K. Robinson)
  - i. The Ventura County Community College District will host a district-wide Lavender Graduation in May, celebrating LGBTQIA+ graduates from Moorpark, Oxnard, and Ventura Colleges, providing an affirming space for students and their communities.
  - ii. Moorpark College held its annual MakerFaire, showcasing interdisciplinary student innovation and hands-on creative activities supported by its makerspace initiative and prior state grant funding.
  - iii. The VCCCD reaffirmed its commitment to environmental sustainability by convening a district-wide workgroup and recommending the hiring of a sustainability consultant to support efforts in reducing water use and waste.
  - iv. Student government elections were completed across all three campuses, including a special election for the VCCCD Student Trustee, with newly elected representatives beginning their terms on June 1.
  - v. Ventura College hosted the FIRST Robotics Competition, bringing together regional student teams to engage in hands-on STEM learning while promoting community engagement and innovation.
