 - i. Total Amount Requested: \$2,225
 - ii. Question: 59% of the students at CSUCI are first generation? (R. Winans)
 1. T. Johnson: Yes, for the past two years there has been this event that is now shadowed from other campuses.
 - iii. Question: What would you say is the benefit from other students that are not a part of the first-generation wave pool? (R. Winans)
 1. T. Johnson: Second generation students qualify and are getting drawn into the festivities, which are getting connected and having the knowledge they may not receive from home.

 - i. Total Amount Requested: \$17,780

- viii. Question: Do you offer different software's in the PC? (M. Rios)
 - 1. L. Sun: There is a lot of programming requests that student have requested, as well as Mac computers that students are requesting.
